What is Erasmus+?

The program was established in 1987 and named after the Dutch philosopher Erasm Rotterdam, who promoted European unification.

Nowadays, 4 components of Erasmus + programme are being implemented in Kyrgyzstan. They are:

- International Credit Mobility,
- Erasmus Joint Master Degrees,
- Capacity Building in Higher Education
- Jean Monnet Program.







Joint Masters Degree



Full financial coverage



Study takes place in at least two universities of Europe




Conferment of joint or multiple masters degree

This is an innovative scholarship program for international exchange and cooperation in the field of higher education. The programs are implemented by a consortium of universities of program countries, sometimes with the participation of partner countries





Masters degrees differentiate by:



the length of the program

- 12 months (60 credit hours)
- 18 months (90 credit hours)
- 24 months (120 credit hours)



the language of teaching

- English (most common)
- German
- French




Student opportunities

Financing conditions

The scholarship for JMD students covers the costs of participation, including:



tuition fees





full insurance package



travel expenses


- 1.000 euro per month for the entire period of study
- 2.000 \3.000 euro per year for travel costs
- up to 9.000 euro per year for scholarship holder

*The amount of the scholarship for travel/accommodation costs depends on the place of residence at the time of applying for the scholarship

Consortium scholarship (full, partial. Depends on program)



Self-funding
(All expenses are covered by the participants themselves)

The deadline for submitting applications is different from the deadline for applying for the Erasmus+ Scholarship!





How to apply?



- The application is submitted online through the program platform/website
- A candidate can apply for an unlimited number of programs per one academic year
- Pay attention to the DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING APPLICATIONS.
 Each program has its own deadlines.






Required documents

- Online application.
- Resume (CV)
- Motivational letter (letter parameters are described in program requirements)
- Diploma(s)
- Diploma addendum (transcript)
- 2 recommendation letters
- Official language certificate (TOEFL, IELTS)
- Valid passport
- Certificate of residence
- (Optional) Any certificates of professional qualification (not work experience)

All documents must be officially translated and notarized!

Step-by-step guide of admission to the program

Application submission

01

Find an application form on a program's website, fill the application, and enter the scanned documents into the database.

Results

03

All applications are considered by the Academic Council.

There are three possible outcomes: "selected", "on the waiting list" or "not selected".

Interview

02

It is a second stage in your admission. There you will be asked about work experience, education, what you can bring new to the program, how you plan to use the acquired knowledge in the future.

Scholarship Approval and visa application

04

Candidates who have successfully passed all the stages receive a notification of the award of a scholarship and admission to the university. Then it remains to apply for a visa and prepare for departure.





Tips for increasing your chances

Application

Find all necessary information about the program on the official website.

If you have any questions, write an email to the official email address listed there.

Recommendation letters

Get recommendation letter from people who know you and your abilities, and could draw an interesting personal and professional portrait.

Motivational letter

Explain why the Program you have chosen fits you;

Demonstrate the correspondence between your experience and the Program;

Highlight your previous experience in education, and in interpersonal communication skills.

Interview

Think of what you can bring to the Program, describe your strengths and weaknesses.


Provide them with new information that they have not read in your application.
