Role of HEREs in Kyrgyzstan

HEREs as drivers of systemic reform



Act as policy-to-practice intermediaries



Connect European higher education principles with national reform priorities



Support evidence-based policy development, institutional capacity building, and structured dialogue between Ministry and universities



Focus: long-term, sustainable reform rather than isolated interventions

Impact Story 1: Strategy and KPIs

Strategic reform and performance orientation

WHAT WAS DONE

- ✓ Contribution to a national higher education reform strategy
- ✓ Introduction of KPIs for university performance

WHY IT WORKED

- Shift from input-based to performance-based governance
- Increased transparency and accountability
- Alignment with EU reform logic (ESG, governance, QA)


IMPACT

- Aligning internal strategies with national priorities
- Foundation for monitoring and future evaluation

Note: impact still emerging – strategy adopted recently

Impact Story 2: Needs Assessment & TAMs

From evidence to capacity building

Impact Story 3: Sector Reviews

Sector reviews as a governance tool



WHAT WAS DONE

- ✓ Regular sector reviews of higher education reforms
- ✓ Thematic focus by year:
 - Ministry-led reforms (2024)
 - Research capacity building (2025)

WHY IT WORKED

- Creates shared understanding among stakeholders
- Strengthens dialogue between Ministry and universities
- Supports evidence-informed policy learning

IMPACT

- Better coordination of reforms
- Increased ownership and trust across the system

Strong alignment with national reform priorities



Evidence-based design (needs assessments, reviews)



Combination of European expertise and local context



Continuous stakeholder engagement


