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International credit mobility (ICM)



International credit mobility (ICM) supports the mobility of individuals in higher education institutions (HEIs), between Programme countries and Partner countries. Through ICM, European HEIs can set up mobility agreements with partners around the world to send and receive students and staff.

International credit mobility (ICM)

What is ICM?



This Erasmus+ action funds short-term mobility of students and staff between Programme and Partner countries

- Manifold benefits for individuals and institutions:
- Key skills & competences, professional development, enhanced employability, teaching methods, etc.
- Increased capacities, attractiveness & internationalisation; improved quality of higher education

International credit mobility (ICM)



Target group:

- Students, academic staff, administrative staff



Duration of mobility

- Students: 2–12 months
- Blended student mobility: (5–30 days physical stay + virtual component)
- Staff: 5 days – 2 months



Levels & disciplines

- Short cycle, Bachelor, Master, PhD – in any subject or academic discipline



Types of activities

- Students: study periods and/or traineeships abroad
- Staff: teaching and/or training (incl. job shadowing, structured training, etc.)



Financial support

- Grants to cover travel and living (subsistence) costs for the funded physical period



Students

- 800-900 EUR/per month



Staff

- 140-190 EUR/per day



Organisational support

- 500 EUR/per participant

International credit mobility (ICM)

Participation & applications

Higher Education Institutions in Programme countries (EU Member States and associated third countries) apply to their National Agency


In the ICM application, the HEI specifies:

- the partner countries and universities (e.g. in Region 6)
- the planned mobilities and cooperation plan for each region

If the proposal meets the quality criteria, the European beneficiary is awarded an ICM grant, divided into regional envelopes, for a project duration of 24 or 36 months

For every partnership with a secured budget, an Inter-Institutional Agreement (IIA) is signed between the main applicant in Europe and each partner university in third countries before mobilities can start

In approved projects, all partner HEIs can send and host students and staff when a grant is available;



were established.




A total of **25 Kyrgyz**
