#### (Social) inclusion in higher education


There is no unified definition of (social) inclusion in HE!

No unified definition of who <u>underrepresented groups</u> or <u>non-traditional students</u> are.

Biggest challenge: defining indicators and measuring it






#### **Comprehensive** internationalisation in higher education

"Commitment confirmed through action to infuse <u>international</u> and <u>comparative perspectives</u> throughout the teaching, research and service missions of higher education. It shapes institutional ethos and values and touches the <u>entire higher education</u> enterprise. It is an institutional <u>imperative</u> not just a desired possibility." (Hudzik 2011:6)

#### Benefits of internationalization (IAU 5th Global Survey, 2019)

- Enhanced international cooperation and capacity building.
- Enhanced internationalization of the curriculum/internationalization at home.
- Enhanced prestige/profile for the institution.
- Improved graduate employability.
- Improved quality of teaching and learning.
- Increased international awareness of/deeper engagement with global issues by students.
- Increased international networking by faculty and researchers.
- Increased/diversified revenue generation.
- Opportunity to benchmark/compare institutional performance within the context of international good practice.
- Strengthened institutional research and knowledge production capacity.






#### Risks of internationalization (IAU 5th Global Survey, 2019)

- International opportunities accessible only to students with financial resources
- Difficulty to assess/ recognize quality of courses/programmes offered by foreign institutions
- Excessive competition with other higher education institutions
- Commodification and commercialization of education programmes
- Brain drain






