

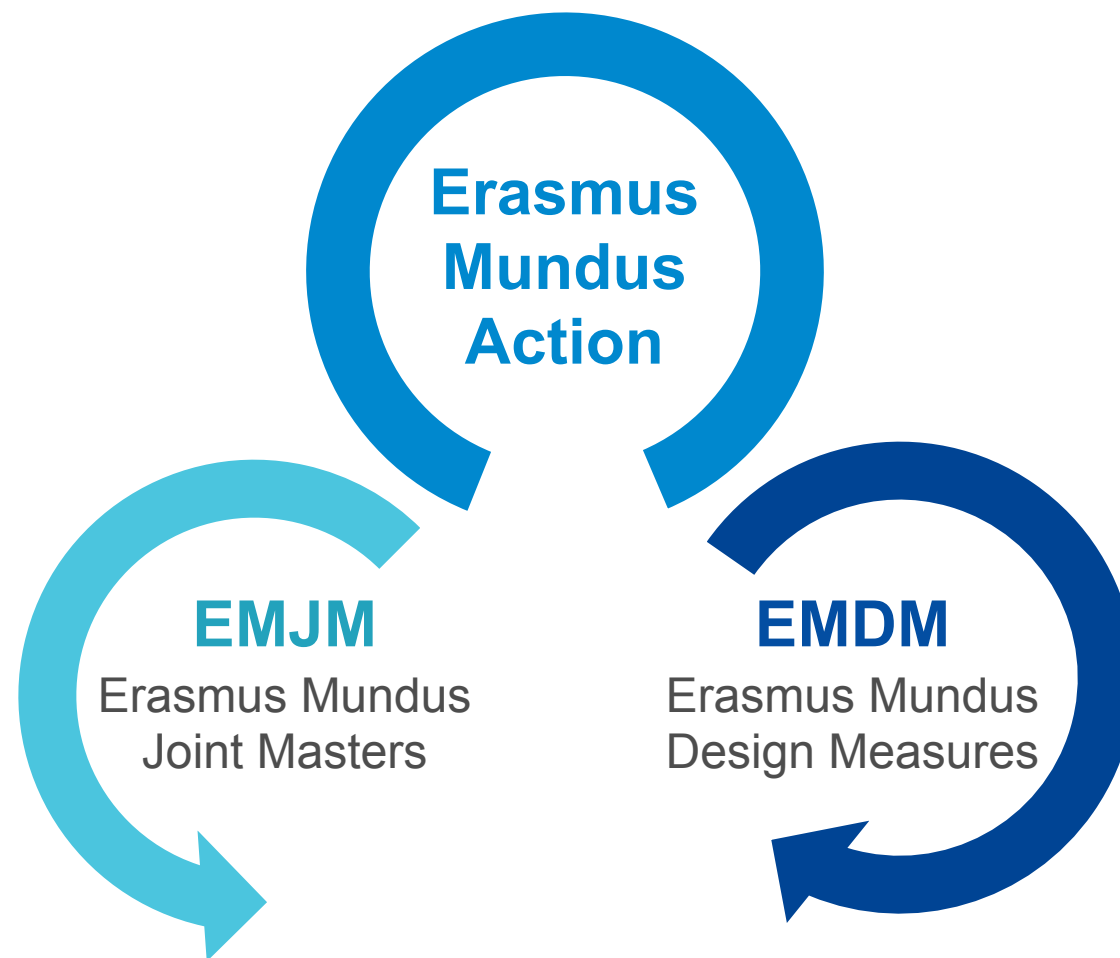

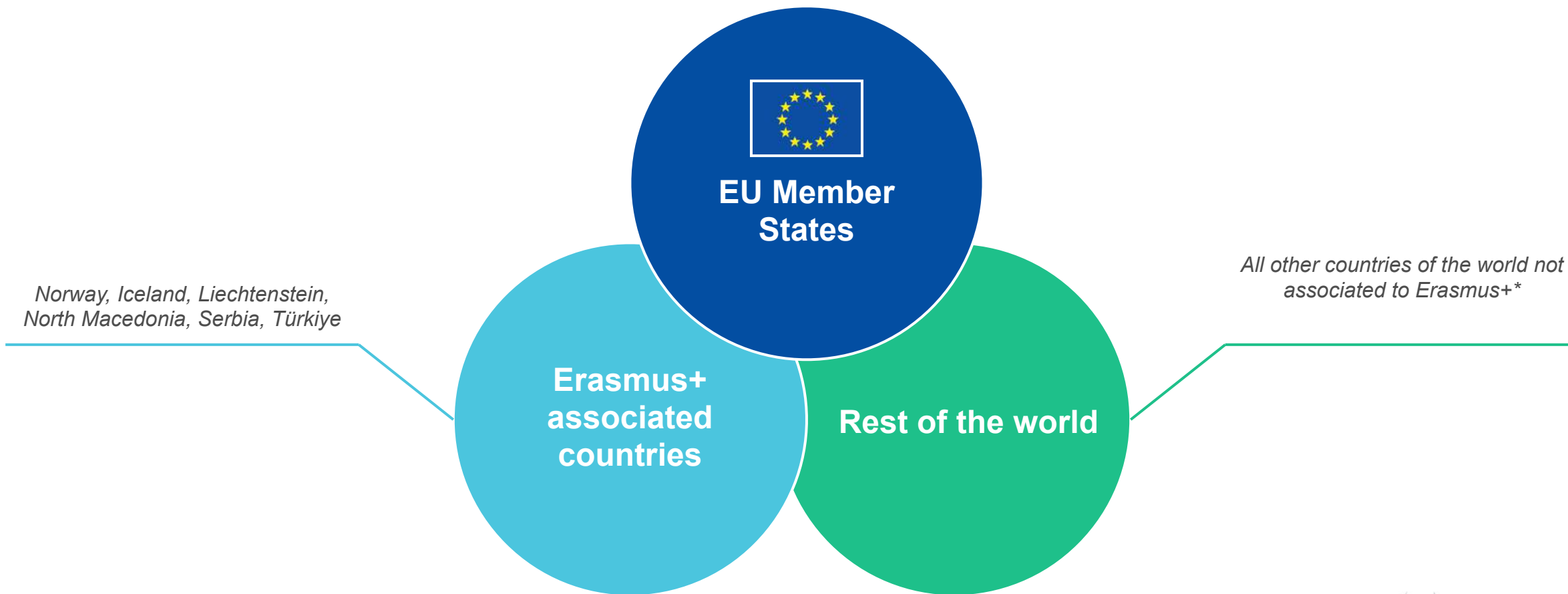

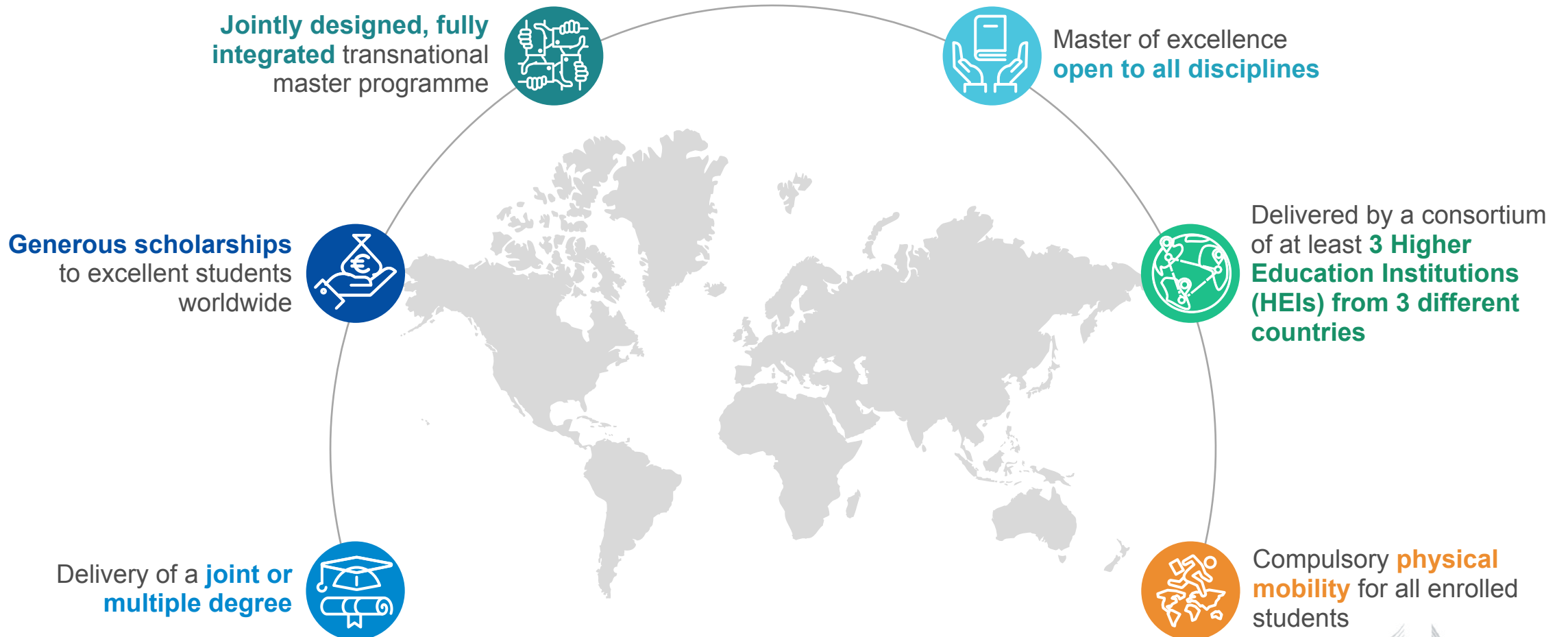


Geographical scope of Erasmus Mundus

What is an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master programme?



Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters – Main objectives



Support quality, innovation, excellence, internationalisation of HEIs through **academic cooperation** within the EHEA and beyond



Increase synergies between **higher education, innovation and research**



Increase **quality and attractiveness** of the European Higher Education Area (EHEA)



Improve **competences, skills and employability** of Master graduates

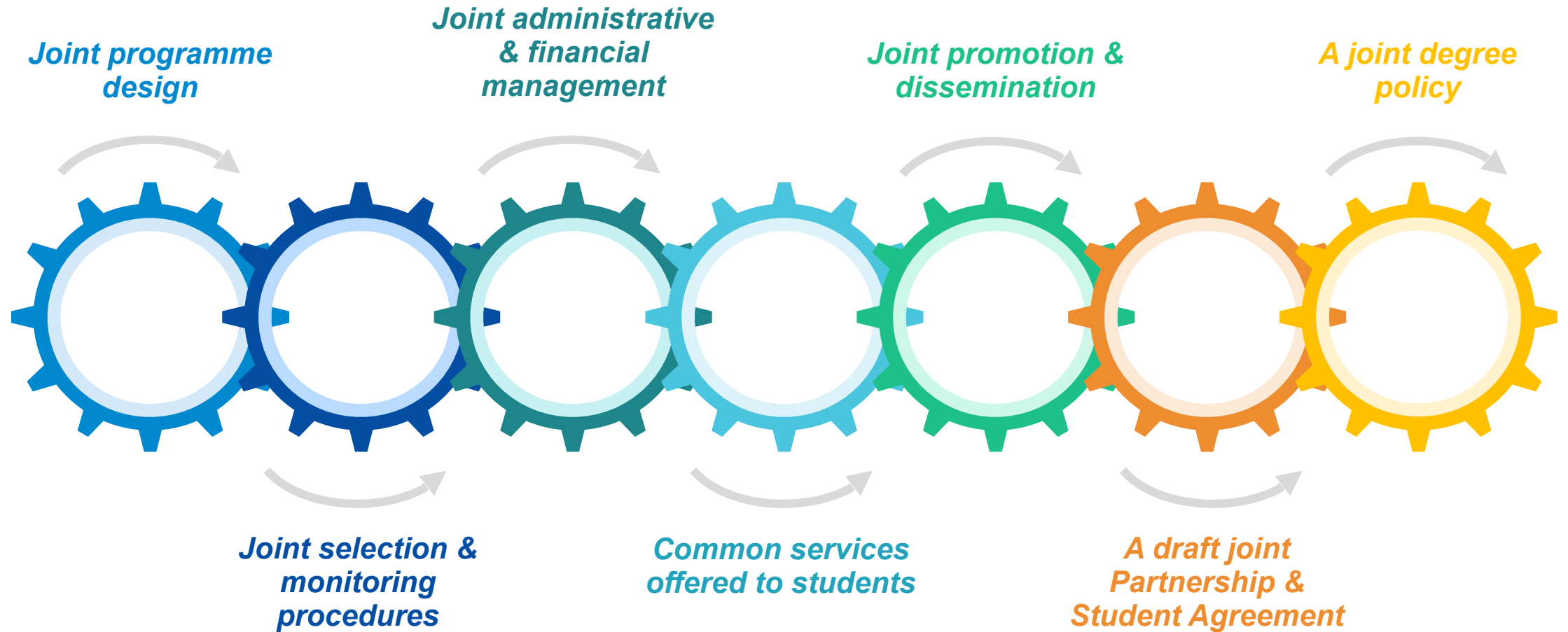


Support **EU External Action** in higher education



Respond to **societal and labour market needs**

Joint mechanisms must be included in the design of the master programme



EMJM Set-up



Grant Agreement of 74 months independently from the length of the master



Commitment to **enrol a certain number of students** per project



At least 4 master editions lasting 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90 or 120 ECTS)



At least 2 study periods in 2 countries (of which at least one in an EU Member State or an Erasmus + associated country, both different from the country of residence of students)



Start of the 1st edition no later than the academic year following the year of project selection



Geographical balance of students: $\leq 10\%$ of total scholarships per project awarded to students of the same nationality (does not apply to additional scholarships for targeted regions)

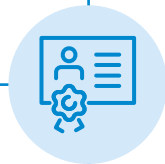
Taking part as an Organisation



Applicants (coordinator & full partners) must be HEIs (**legal entities**) established in any country worldwide. Any public or private organization worldwide may also participate but not as coordinator



For HEIs in EU Member States and Erasmus + associated countries: **valid Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE)**



For HEIs in third countries not associated to Erasmus+: should **commit to ECHE principles** in the Partnership Agreement



For HEIs applying as coordinator and full partners: **completed accreditation/evaluation of the master programme**



Minimum consortium: **3 HEIs from 3 different countries** of which at least 2 must be an EU Member State or an Erasmus + associated country. Optional: other full academic or non-academic partners and associated partners

Applicants must:

- hold **a first higher education degree** or equivalent
- **not have benefited previously from** an EMJM scholarship



The best ones can benefit from a scholarship depending on the number of scholarships available

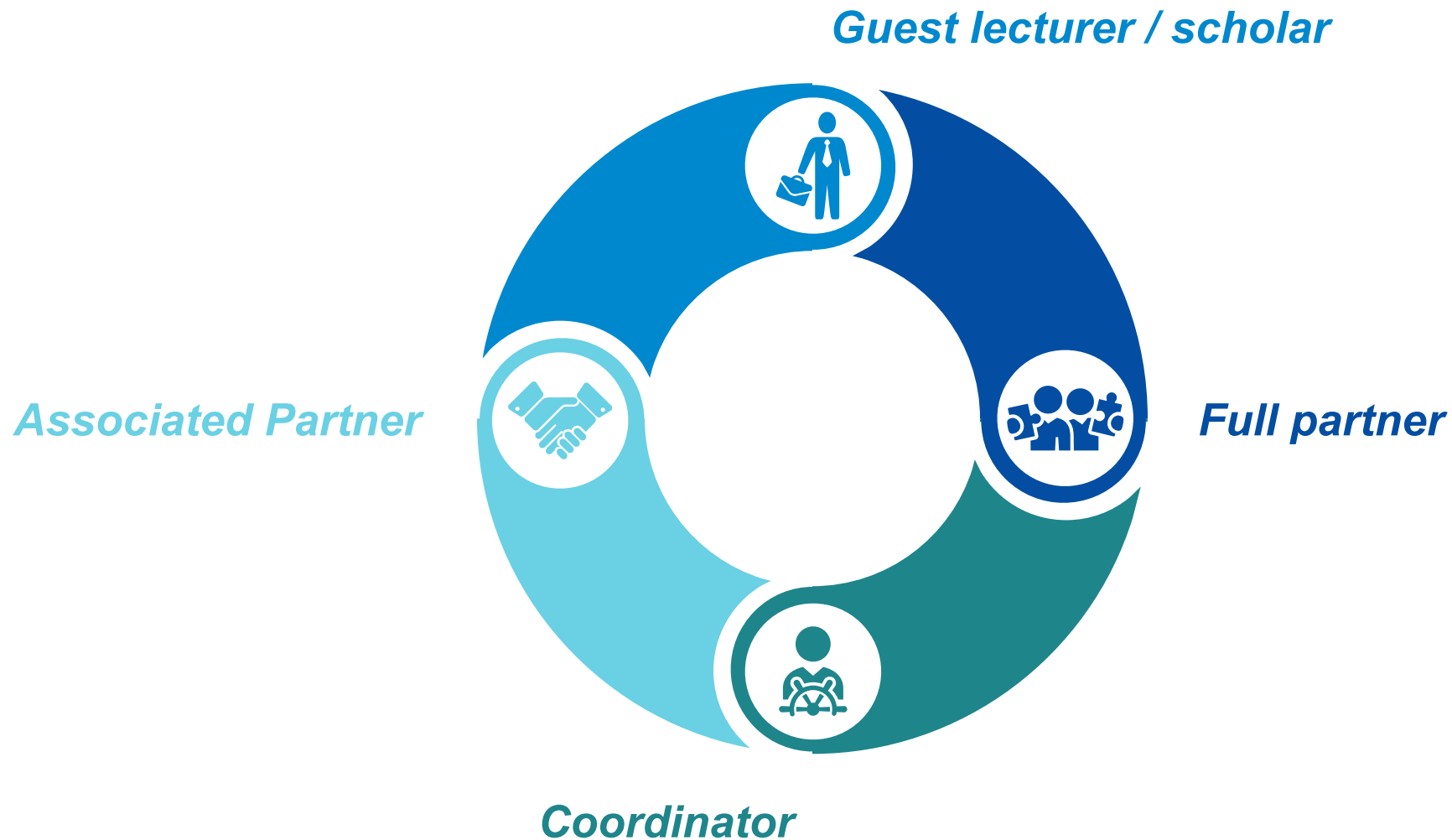


Students **apply directly to the EMJM consortium.**

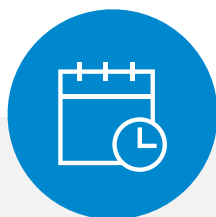

What is an EMDM project?



Short duration **grant of 15 months to support institutions** in the set-up of a new joint master programme in Europe (and beyond)



One beneficiary mobilising a group of other HEIs (mono-beneficiary grant)



EU Grant: fixed **lump sum contribution of EUR 60,000** for costs linked to the activities necessary to set up the new joint master programme



Independent funding scheme from EMJM (independent calls for proposals)

Taking part as an Organisation



Applications can be submitted by any eligible HEI



HEIs should be able to deliver a minimum level of education corresponding to **ISCED 7** (International Standard Classification of Education master level)



HEIs in EU Member States and associated countries: **valid Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE)**
