PhD candidates - vacancies

- If you intend to complete a PhD in Europe with MSCA, take a look at the <u>list</u> of MSCA vacancies published in EURAXESS, which is updated daily
- Funding for specific vacancies, not for tuition fees
- Apply directly to the institution or project of your choice
- You will be recruited by a host organisation in Europe for a period of 3 years (up to 4 years in some cases)
- The grant will cover your salary, mobility allowances, tuition, research and training costs and family allowances
- Conditions:
 - ➤ No nationality or age limits
 - ➤ You must **NOT hold a doctoral degree**
 - ➤ You cannot have carried out your main activity in the country that will host you for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately preceding the vacancy's deadline to apply



Postdoctoral researchers – vacancies

- If you intend to do a post-doctorate with MSCA, take a look at the <u>list of vacancies published in EURAXESS</u>, which is updated daily.
- Apply directly to the institution or project of your choice
- In most cases, you will be recruited by a host organisation in Europe for a period of up to 2 years
- The grant will cover your salary, mobility allowances, tuition, research and training costs and family allowances
- Conditions:
 - ➤ No nationality or age limits
 - ➤ You must have a **doctoral degree** or have defended your doctoral thesis successfully
 - ➤ You should not have carried out Your main activity in the country that will host you for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately preceding the vacancy's deadline to apply

European Postdoctoral Fellowships

- Highly prestigious fellowships recognised at global level
- Support for postdoctoral researchers to train and develop their career in Europe
- Funding for projects in all scientific disciplines
- Grants of up to 2.5 years, all expenses covered
- You should prepare a project with your potential supervisor and submit it in reply to the annual call for proposals
- Conditions:
 - > You must have a doctoral degree or have successfully defended the doctoral thesis
 - ➤ There are no limitations on age or nationality
 - Limitations for researchers with more than 8 years of research experience since obtaining their (first) doctoral degree
 - ➤ Mobility rule: the researcher cannot have carried out his/her main activity in the host country for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately preceding the closing date of the call

- Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions provide funding for organisations in all scientific disciplines
 - > From all socio-economic sectors
 - ➤ Different modalities of participation depending on the scheme
 - Third country organisations may receive funding or host/send researchers, academic and administrative staff paid for with EU funding
 - ➢ Possibility to create connections, attract talent, develop new collaborative projects

 - <u>FAQs</u> on the Funding & Tender Opportunities portal
- Find partners with whom to form a consortium and announce your organisation as a potential partner for the call for interest:
 - On the Funding & Tender Opportunities Portal via the partner search function
 - For MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships, find researchers interested in developing a project with your organisation <u>by publishing hosting offers on Euraxess</u>
- Register your organisation to participate in a proposal or call. Follow the link to register your organisation to get a PIC number


